Levine Act - To promote transparency and fairness in government decision-making, the Levine Act imposes contribution prohibitions and disclosure requirements. Specifically, any elected or appointed City officer is prohibited from making or attempting to influence a decision in a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use if the officer received a contribution of more than \$500 within the preceding 12 months from a party or their agent. (Gov. Code § 84308(c)(1).) Additionally, parties to proceedings involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before any elected or appointed City officer must disclose any campaign contributions exceeding \$500 that they made within the preceding 12 months. 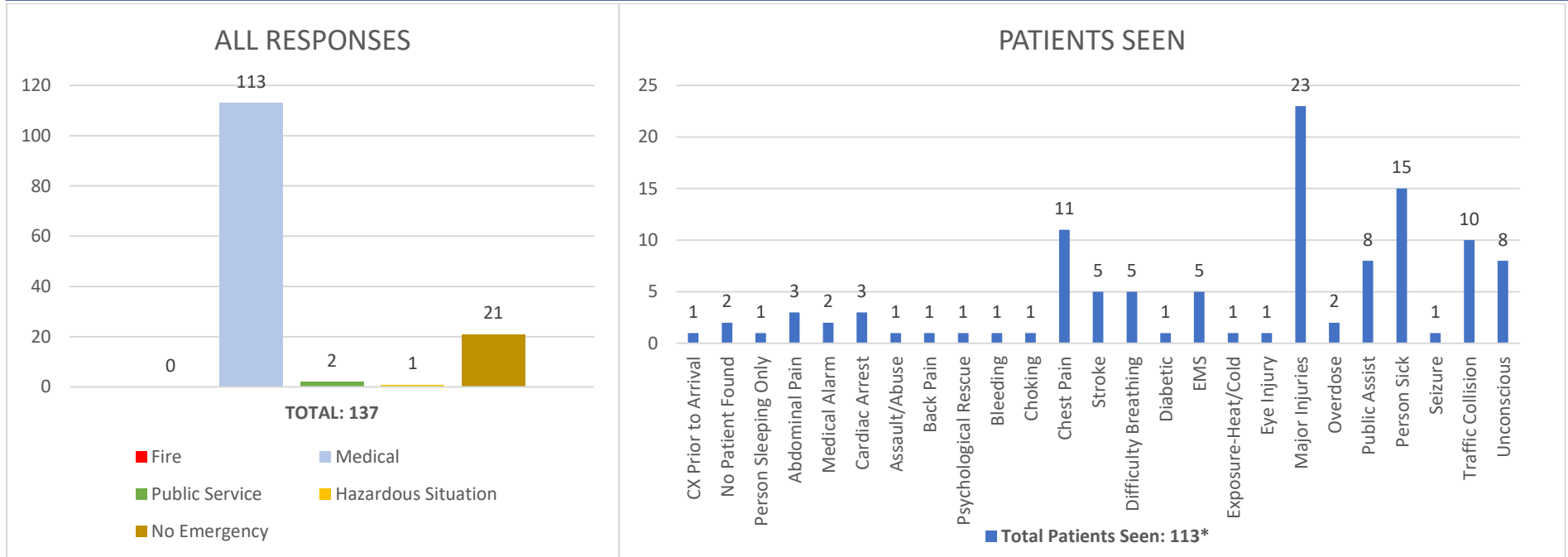

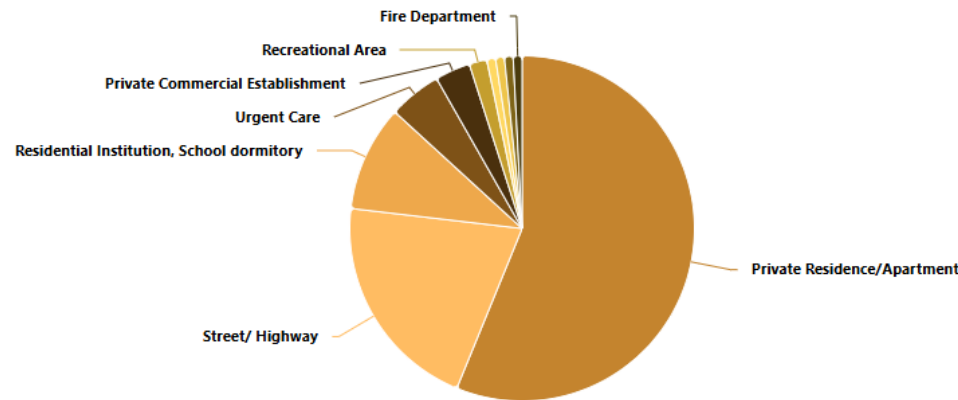

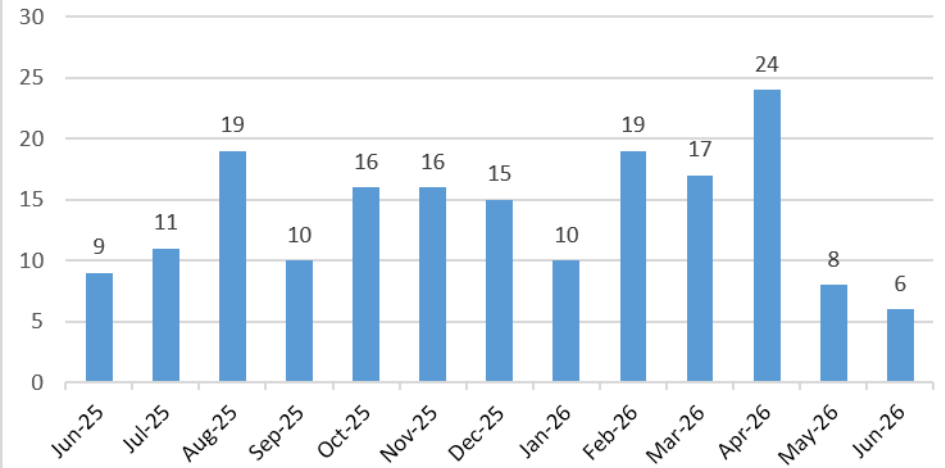

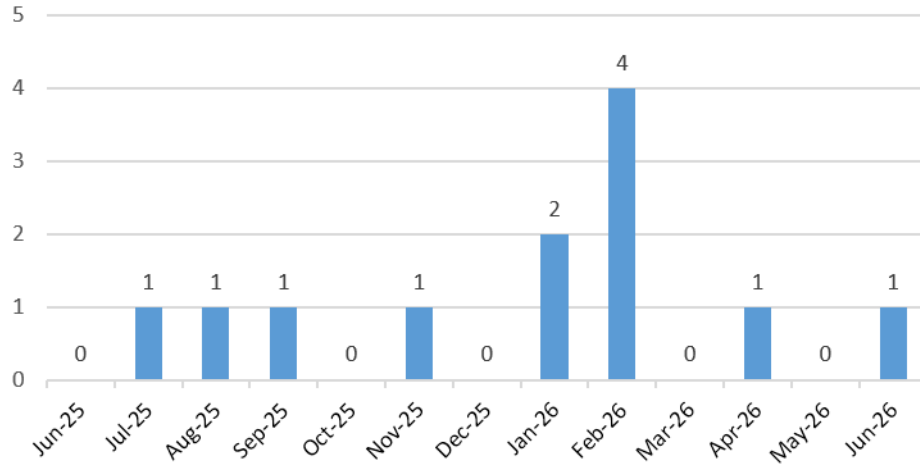

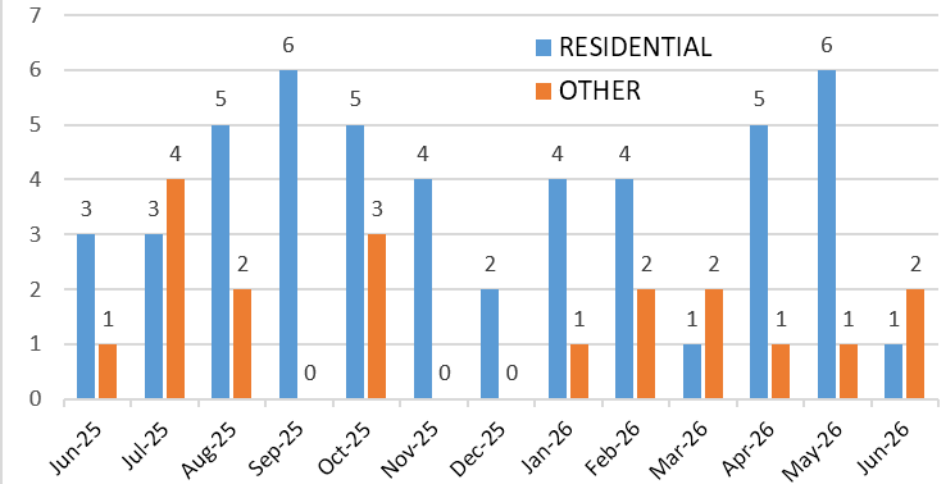

Background:

The City utilizes public service announcements (PSAs) throughout the year to educate the community on topics that promote public safety, emergency preparedness, and community awareness. These announcements are distributed through the City's communication channels, including the City website, social media platforms, electronic newsletters, and other outreach materials, to provide timely and relevant information to the community.

Seasonal PSA campaigns allow the City to address issues that are most applicable during a particular time of year while reinforcing preparedness and encouraging proactive measures by residents.
